**TRIM YOUR TREES**

**Please trim your trees that hang over the street. Please trim them behind the curb and 14 ft. above the street or the Village will do it and send you a bill. Call if you have questions!**

**Building Permits**

Roger Mayer is the building inspector. Permit applications are obtained from the Village Office. Roger will issue and deliver the permit. Any improvements or repairs costing more than **\$500** require a building permit.

**Dog & Cat Licenses**

**All dogs and cats must be licensed.** The deadline for licensing your pet was April 1, 2021. The cost is \$5 for spayed or neutered and \$10 for male or female. A \$20.00 late fee for dog licenses now. **All dogs running loose must be kept on your own property or must be on a leash when going off of your property.** The village ordinance also requires dog walkers to carry a container to pick up after their dog. This is a matter of courtesy to other people using the sidewalks or lawns.

**IF YOUR DOG POOPS ON YOUR NEIGHBORS LAWN, BE COURTEOUS AND PICK IT UP! NO ONE LIKES TO STEP IN YOUR DOG FECES THAT YOU LEAVE BEHIND!**

**Also, No Dogs are allowed in the Park – if you walk through, pick up after them! No lawnmowers are allowed in the park!**

**Grass Clippings**

**DO NOT BLOW YOUR GRASS CLIPPINGS ONTO STREETS. IT BLOCKS UP THE STORM SEWERS.** Please mow the edge of your lawn along the curb so the grass blows into your yard. Thanks!

**Tall Grass, Weeds, & Junk Lying Around**

Think of your neighbors as you are cleaning up your yards. There are some properties where the grass and weeds are growing taller than they should. Please cut and/or trim your yards. This includes the back yards of your property. Long grass and weeds provide a habitat for wild animals that we do not want coming into the village. Please take care of your yards now so the Village does not have to contact you to do it. Thank you for your cooperation! Letters may be going out to people who do not comply. **Also, many properties have junk lying around the lawn and house. This is not allowed in the Village and you must remove the junk and clean up your yard. You may get a visit or letter if this applies to you.**

**Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles**

**All vehicles must be licensed and operable to be sitting on your property. If not, they are considered junk vehicles and must be removed from the Village. You may be getting a visit or a letter if this pertains to you.**

**Meetings / Elections**

Village meetings are held at the Village Hall, 228 West Main Street. The regular meeting is held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. Special meetings and committee meetings are held on call. Watch for postings at the Village Hall, Village Shop and Post Office.

### **No Burning**

Burning is not allowed in the village limits. Only recreational campfires for cooking purposes are allowed.

**No Burning Of Garbage.** There is also no burning of leaves, sticks, grass or household rubbish. **No burning barrels are allowed in the village.**

### **Taxes**

The second installment of property taxes are due by July 31, 2021 to the Manitowoc County Treasurer.

### **4<sup>th</sup> Of July**

With the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday fast approaching, just a reminder that it is illegal to shoot off fireworks in the village. All fireworks that shoot into the air are illegal and could pose a threat to neighboring property and roofs. Although they are very pretty to watch, you must be considerate of your neighbors.

### **Golf Carts, ATV's or UTV's**

**NO VEHICLES/ATV/GOLF CARTS ARE ALLOWED IN THE PARK OTHER THAN THE PARKING LOT!**

### **Village Ordinance:**

#### **● Sec. 34-17. - Golf carts, ATVs or UTVs.**

A golf cart, ATV or UTV is defined as a motorized vehicle with four wheels that is designed to be operated at a speed of more than 25 miles per hour and generally designed to carry four persons including the driver.

(b)

No golf cart, ATV or UTV shall be operated on any village street unless it is equipped with proper and functional brakes, headlights, tail lights, rear view mirror, "slow moving vehicle" sign, and a safety flag on a staff holder such that the flag is at least eight feet above the road surface.

(c)

Upon request, the owner or operator of a golf cart, ATV or UTV in the village must provide a certificate of insurance showing the insurer's name, the policy term, and liability limits of not less than \$100,000.00 per person and \$300,000.00 per accident as well as \$5,000.00 in medical expense coverage.

(d)

No person shall operate a golf cart, ATV or UTV upon village streets, alley or public rights-of-way within the village limits unless such person shall have a valid motor vehicle operator's license. Operation of golf carts, ATVs or UTVs within the village limits shall be permitted only subject to the following:

(1)

Carts shall be operated in compliance with state law and village traffic regulations.

(2)

Golf cart, ATV or UTV use is permitted on village streets except CTH A or CTH C. Crossing both CTH A and CTH C is permitted.

(3)

Cart shall be operated on the extreme right side of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic.

(4)

Cart operators shall yield the right-of-way to all other vehicular traffic and pedestrians.

(5)

Carts operated on any portion of any roadway or shoulder of a highway shall observe the posted speed limit for that roadway.

(6)

No person shall allow any golf cart, ATV or UTV owned or operated by him to remain unattended on any public street, highway or public property while the motor is running or with the starting key left in the ignition.

(7)

Carts may be operated on village roadways only between April 1 and November 1 of each year and only between one-half hours after sunrise until one-half hour before sunset.

(8)

Golf carts, ATVs or UTVs may not operate on village streets during inclement weather such as rain, snow or fog, or when due to weather visibility is less than 500 feet.

(9)

No item may be towed by a golf cart, ATV or UTV.

(10)

No animals shall be permitted to ride in or on any golf cart, ATV or UTV.

(11)

Golf cart, ATV or UTV occupants must remain seated at all times during operation.

(12)

If the cart is or was originally equipped with seatbelts, all occupants shall comply with seatbelt regulations.

(e)

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

*ATV (all-terrain vehicle)* means a commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less, has a width of 50 inches or less, is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and travels on three or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.

*UTV (also known as a utility task vehicle, utility terrain vehicle, or side-by-side)* means a two- or four-person motorized off-road vehicle usually with wider and longer stances than ATVs. UTVs are designed for off-road use, and typically have all-wheel drive, an open cab, and a truck like bed.

#### **Bulky Garbage Disposal**

Advanced Disposal has changed their procedures for picking up bulky items. Since they only have one person on the garbage truck, they are not able pick up any items not placed in a garbage bag. We have listed some of your options below.

#### **Ways to get rid of bulky items:**

- 1) **Rent a dumpster from the Village or from any local garbage hauler. You must call for information.**
- 2) **Take your items to the United Ministries Thrift Store here in the Village, 920-773-3050. They will pick up too.  
Only items that work!**
- 3) **Call GIF and they will arrange curbside pickup for a fee, (920) 333-8183**
- 4) **Haul your items to Ridgeview Landfill 920-732-4473 or Hickory Meadows Landfill 920-853-8553. Call ahead for costs.**
- 5) **Contact Mike Plate – 920-323-5110. He will pick up all unwanted scrap metal: washers ,dryers, stoves, dishwashers, water heaters, sheet metal, heavy iron, cast iron sinks and bath tubs, car parts, batteries, rotors, rims, electric motors, wiring, copper pipe, steel pipe, brass, aluminum, lawnmowers, snow blowers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and any appliance or metal as long as it has a cord on it. He does charge a fee for TV's based on size, and refrigerators and freezers. Call Mike with questions and fees**

- 6) Be sure to watch the papers for the local clean sweeps that the county holds to get rid of paints, chemicals, medications, etc.
- 7) Call the Village Office 773-2471 or Advanced Disposal 920-849-9544 with questions.

**Inlcuded is the annual Consumer Confidence Report for the St Nazianz Water Utility.**

**FYI:** The village was forced to do water, sewer & street repairs on n 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue due to a severe water main break in January of 2020. So 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue was breaking up badly, so before we put new blacktop in, new water mains and storm sewer mains were installed as well as the sewer mains were relined.

As a result, loans were taken out for those projects which means more payments which means we must raise our water and sewer rates effective with the 9/10/2021 billing. Rates have not been set yet, but the new rates will be listed on the back of the 9/10/2021 bill for your reference. There will also be postings at the post office, village shop & village hall before the rates are implemented. We have not raised the water rates since 2015 (6 years) and the sewer rates have not been raised since 2018 (3 years). Water rates are controlled by the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin.

The rates we will be implementing will not get the utilities out of financial trouble, but we are trying to take baby steps to eventually have more cash flow, and rates may be going up a bit every year in the coming years.

Since we have been passing wet tests at the sewer plant, hopefully we will be able to stop consulting with our engineer and attorney on a monthly basis and that too will help the sewer plant budget and financials.

We all are feeling the craziness of costs rising everywhere since COVID 19. Let's hope things will be back to normal sooner rather than later.
